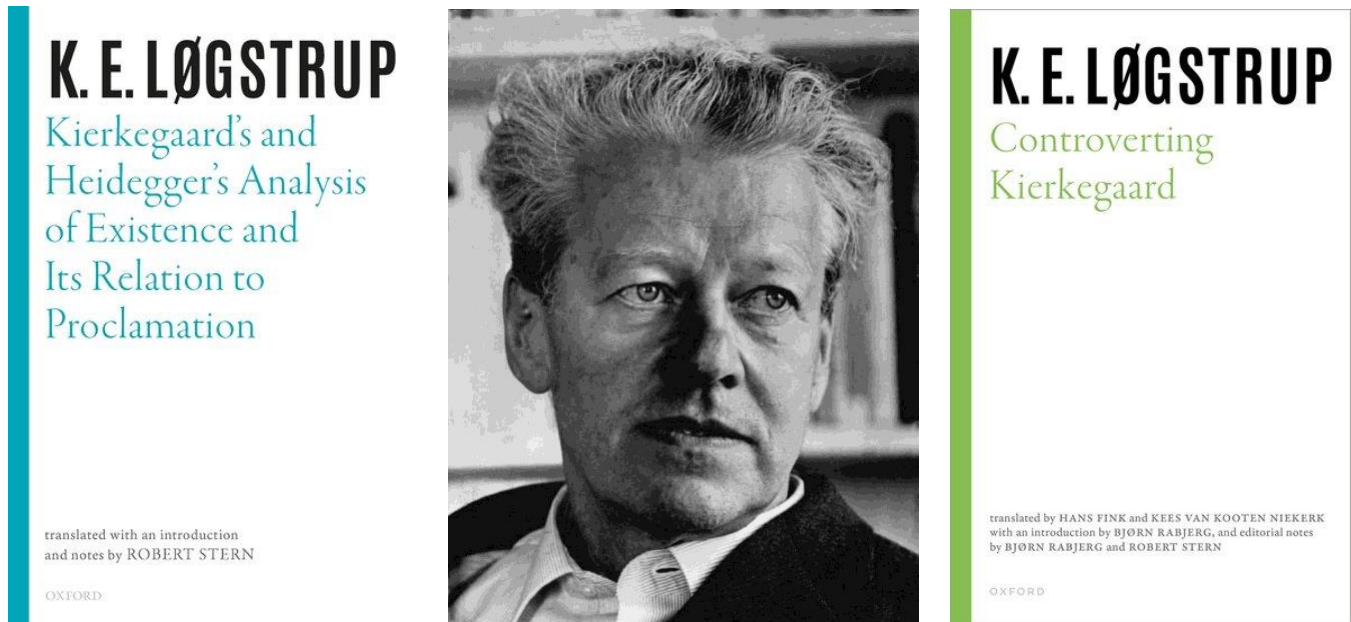


Fall 2026: Løgstrup's Critique of Kierkegaard

An Online Reading Workshop on the Writings K.E. Løgstrup



American researcher Dr. Michael Au-Mullaney and the Løgstrup Research Center are collaborating on a weekly online reading workshop on the writings of 20th century Danish philosopher-theologian K.E. Løgstrup. The workshop is in English, online, and open to interested readers everywhere. This term, we will read two works by Løgstrup that deal with his critiques of Søren Kierkegaard and some of Kierkegaard's 20th century interpreters:

- *Kierkegaard and Heidegger's Analysis of Existence and its Relation to Proclamation*, a series of lectures delivered in Germany in which Løgstrup began to formulate his concept of "the ethical demand" as a response to Kierkegaard's concepts of being lost in the crowd vs. living authentically before God, being under an infinite demand before God, the question of taking over concrete existence, and the nature of guilt.
- *Controverting Kierkegaard*, where Løgstrup challenged Kierkegaard's understanding of Christianity and gave the first robust account of his concept of "sovereign expressions of life," which permeated the rest of his writings.
- We will also read a small selection of texts by Kierkegaard, K. Olesen Larsen, and Johannes Sløk that shed light on opposing views.

Participation is free and informal, anyone is welcome to join. The level of discussion should be suitable for both faculty, researchers, graduate students, advanced undergraduates, as well as anyone interested in the study of theology or philosophy.
